Project SAFE CRCA to Host "Project SAFE Community Conversation" a Town Hall style of meeting at Anamosa High School Ellen Kennedy Performing Arts Center, April 19th. panel including a Monticello and an Anamosa High School student, the two junior/senior high school counselors from Midland, Melissa Paulsen, a therapist from RISE, a psychiatrist from Cedar Rapids, a parent from Marion who serves Jones County as a Parent Partner. Mike Farr, who started Project SAFE, lost his own son to suicide at age 17 a few years ago, and is doing these events trying to prevent this from happening to other kids and families.

It's going to be a great free meal (smoked pulled pork sandwiches and sides) and about 15 different agencies will be attending the resource fair during the meal at 5. Then the panel discussion is at 6:30, all the Anamosa HS Performing arts center (and lobby to eat and have the resource fair). Another great part is Project SAFE is offering three scholarships with a drawing for those 9th-12th grade students in attendance. They have to be present to win. There is one for \$1000, and two for \$500, to any type of school of their choice after high school, and they will save it for them until they are ready if they are younger.

Wyoming Annual Grass and Weed Abatement Notice- Grasses, weeds, brush, dense growth shall be kept at a maximum of 6" in residential, business and Industrial property from May 1 to October 31. No other notice will be given before the City will abate the notice and shall assess all costs incurred to the property.
