Holly took over the business in 1989. Ade was a 30+ year officer of the Wyoming Fair Association and Holly served on the board for many years.

Midland School Bond issue results: passed 67.6%, required 60% to pass.

#### Midland Times 3-3-1988:

Wyoming City Council passed an ordinance providing for the creation of the Wyoming Historical Museum Commission and appointed Commission members. Midland Junior **John Stender** finished 5<sup>th</sup> at State Wrestling. His season record was 28-5-0 and his career record is 67-25-1.

## Wyoming Journal 2-20-1908:

The railroad company yesterday settled with Henry Eichhorn for damages to wagon and team by reason of the accident on Green Street crossing January 1<sup>st</sup>, paying him \$150.00. (Ed note: Most people don't know that Wyoming had a railroad, much less that it crossed Green Street.)

## Wyoming Journal 3-5-1908:

The old depot was taken down by the railroad company the first of the week and shipped west. It may show up somewhere as a very good pioneer depot. (Ed note: Again, a few people remember the last depot which was taken down in the 1970's. That one was located where the storage units are. The "old" one was located further down the line to the south.)

**To avoid frozen water lines –** An indicator of an impending water service line freeze up is to check the temperature of your water after running it until it is cold. (Allow your water to run until it is cold and then check the temperature.) The water temperature should be around 45 degrees. If the temperature drops to 38 degrees or below, you may have an impending freeze up and the frost may be getting close to your service line. If your water is rusty in color, this is an indication that your water line is starting to freeze up and you should run water on a continuous basis at the size of pencil lead stream.
