

Percentage of the African American population under age 5, in 2019. African Americans have a higher concentration of preschoolers among the population than the state as a whole (6.2%).

The African American population in five counties: Polk, Scott, Linn, Black Hawk, and Johnson in 2020. this accounts for 70.3% of the total African American population in lowa.

Over half of the growth in Iowa's African American population from 2010-2020 occurred in three counties: Polk, Linn and Johnson.

The percent of the African American population living in Des Moines in 2020. Des Moines has the largest population (25,011) of African Americans in any city in Iowa.

The percent of the total population in Waterloo who are African American in 2020. Other Iowa cities with a high percentage of African Americans are Coralville (14.0%) and Davenport (12.0%).
