Geniyah Morgan, 10, Onslow, Iowa November 18, 2022

A Celebration of Life for Geniyah Morgan will be held Sunday, November 27th at The Calkins Barn in Wyoming from 4-6 PM. A funeral will be held in Chicago next week.

A crew of volunteers are helping the family prepare. Donations of cookies or bars will be accepted. If donating, please bring the cookies or bars in a disposable container such as a paper plate, zip lock bag, etc.

The sidewalks on the business block of Main Street are not that old, but many are showing the effects of excessive salt usage. This is not just damage to the surface but is also structurally seen in the cracking. Your word for today is "spalling".

Getting rid of ice and snow on your sidewalk and driveway:

De-icing products offer welcome assistance in the task of removing snow and ice from walking surfaces. BUT, if you use too much, you risk damaging your masonry. If you repeatedly use heavy amounts of sidewalk salt, you risk the scaling and flaking of your masonry surfaces. Some rules to follow:

- if your concrete sidewalks or steps are less than 6 months old, do not use de-icing products. At this stage, the concrete is extra sensitive and prone to damage.
- Check the ingredients list. If your product has ammonium sulfate or ammonium nitrate, don't use it! These products are extra damaging to masonry.
- Mix your salt with sand to improve traction.

- In the spring, wash any areas that had salt to get rid of the residue.
- There are four (4) types of de-icing salts:
 - Sodium Chloride (rock salt) and Calcium Chloride these should be avoided as they are harmful to masonry, surrounding vegetation, and human skin.
 - Potassium Chloride and Magnesium Chloride these are great choices as they contain drastically fewer harmful chemicals.

For those of you who have post office boxes:

- 1) If you receive notice of a package in the parcel lockers in the lobby, please claim it promptly. The lockers allow postal customers to pick up packages after hours. As there are more parcels coming in than there are lockers, parcels will be held in lockers for 3 days. They will then be moved to the back for pick up at the window during business hours. If packages are not claimed in 15 days, they are required to be returned to the sender.
- 2) Many vendors will give you the tracking number when you place your order. Watch that number so that you can pick up your parcel as soon as possible after it arrives at the PO.
- 3) Please pick up your mail every other day or at least weekly. Boxes get full and make it hard to put more mail in them. If this continues, you can be required to get a bigger box which will cost more.
- 4) Update your PO box application if you have someone new receiving mail at your box. Mail addressed to someone whose name is not on your application will not be put in your box.

There has been an increase in the number of pieces of mail coming with senders using random PO box numbers and street addresses.
